INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP PROGRAM - Also, we will be looking for hosts to get involved with our International Friendship Program that pairs students with local community members who offer their support in terms of expanding the educational experience (other than academic studies) to help international visitors learn about our American culture, environment, sports,

Because we learn so many of our basic assumptions, values, and behavior patterns at an early age, we rarely think about them as we conduct our daily lives. We tend to assume that most of our behavior and beliefs are "natural," that is, universally experienced. The ability to accept those differences helps in building relationships with people from other cultures.
