So much of what I have experienced so far at the International House is tied to these rich moments of transition. Visitors walking into the house during their first days in the United States.. Others departing and saying goodbye as they venture back to their home country. In both moments of entry and exit, I've witnessed the power of community, connection and friendship.

The history of the International House is rich and we have been present for so many of these beginnings and endings. Our mission of promoting friendship, connection, learning, and global understanding by bringing people together from around the world for cross-cultural exchange is as important and relevant today as it was in 1963 when the organization was founded. Indeed, the focus on bringing diverse people together to foster greater understanding is what drew me to the organization and what will guide my approach to our work. In my early weeks as Director I've been meeting many of the individuals that make up this community - alumni, students, board



members, tutors, teachers, committee members, residents, community partners and staff members. A common thread through these early interactions has emerged; the house is a uniquely important place for those who use it. Something special and important happens when people from different backgrounds and perspectives come together. This sentiment was captured by several participants at one of Risa's final Socrates Cafe sessions this summer:

"There are no limits here based on age, gender, nationality - we are all human beings coming together - this should be the way it is in all of the world!"

"This is a Museum of Beauty - I weep inside with joy and hope to bring this feeling back to my home country"

"All these cultures coming together and interacting - this gives us hope for the future - it is for everyone, not just one group"

And so it is with enthusiasm, as well as respect for the organization's rich history, that I enter this new beginning. I will be carrying forward these sentiments as I work with our staff, board and community at large to guide the future direction of the International House.
