Student Story

Hui-Tzu Peng



Hui-Tzu Peng arrived in Providence in August 2019 to join her fiance, Cho-Tao Huang, who had been living here since 2013 when he came to study at Rhode Island School of Design.

"I was excited," Hui-Tzu says, " but a little nervous and sad to leave my family, friends, and job in Taiwan."

Although she had studied English for many years, it was always in formal settings that focused on grammar and test taking. "I had limited experience in conversation and socialization," she explains.

"Finally, at International House, I've been able to learn English in a warm, comfortable, family-like setting. It's been a great environment for learning and adapting to my new home. And I've met many wonderful people here, from all over the world."

In addition to taking group classes, Hui Tzu has also signed up for one-onone tutoring. "I've been matched with Mary Troeger, an IH volunteer, who also happens to be a RISD graduate and weaver. We meet once a week to work on customized lessons, and we've developed a special friendship that I treasure."

One day Hui Tzu noticed in the newsletter that International House was looking for volunteers with graphic design experience. She jumped at the opportunity. Joining the small committee involved with marketing and communications, she worked on several projects including the new logo which we've just unveiled.

"It's been great to form new relationships and connect with others by using art!"

Cho Tao Huang and Hui Tzu got married at City Hall in October, 2019. She got her green card in March 2020.

"As I prepare to pursue work in this country, my experiences at International House are helping me tremendously. I started my first job with an American company in January 2021. I can't imagine my time in America without the community and support I've developed here."



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
